5 questions with Mayor Ken Adams

What will residents see happening in Olive Branch in 2024?

The City has allocated \$4 million on roadway resurfacing continuing on its comprehensive roadway improvement investment from 2023. We will see several groundbreaking this year for a new Fire Station to serve the citizens in the newly annexed area, a New Animal Shelter, and a Public Works Building. We will also begin construction on a new water plant and well located at the Craft Road Water tower. This \$4.3 million investment will greatly enhance the entire water system for the City. We will see new park enhancements to the City Park, including pickle ball courts, a new walking trail, and an 18-hole frisbee disc golf course. Four new soccer fields with a parking lot expansion will be a welcomed addition to George Harrison Park along Church Road. There will also be many community events happening this year such as the Solar Eclipse Viewing on April 8th. Be sure to join us in City Park to pick up your eclipse glasses!

What is the Mayor's role in promoting Economic Development?

The Mayor, in any local government, is the top executive overseeing departments and leading Board meetings. The Mayor's duties vary from municipality to municipality. My duties as Mayor of the City of Olive Branch allow me to work alongside the Board of Aldermen to oversee City Operations and other developments. Our City has an excellent mixture of residential, commercial, and industrial buildings that all play into our Economic Development. Our City's Global Assessed Value in 2023 was \$869.5 million. This is a 9.3% increase from 2022; the highest value of all cities in this county. The total assessed value of all cities and unincorporated areas of county was \$2.53 billion, indicating that Olive Branch accounts for over 34% of the total assessed value of all DeSoto County. This is evident by the increase in value of our homes in Olive Branch.

What kind of infrastructure investments do you believe are critical in order to best support the growth of our City?

Investments in our roadways always play a part in the support of the growth of our City. Last year, we completed over 68 lane miles of roadway resurfacing—the largest resurfacing project in our City's 151-year history! This multi-year plan will address all roadway issues in the City and will have more to come this year with \$4 million allocated to roadway improvements and infrastructure in 2024. We still have a way to go to get all streets improved across the City, **but we have a plan!** Sewer infrastructure improvements in the area of HWY 305 and HWY 78 along with additional infrastructure improvements for water and gas will greatly improve the existing system. There are several significant sewer capacity projects that are currently under design in the Eastern part of the City. In 2024, the Olive Branch Fire Department will see the arrival of a 100' Ladder Truck for Station #3 along with a new Fire Engine for our 6th Fire Station to help keep our residents safe. Olive Branch Fire Department is one of only five Fire Departments in the state that operates their own ambulance service. The strength of our Fire Department is the men and women who serve our City in this capacity.

What is the City's plan to combat litter?

It takes all of us to keep Olive Branch beautiful! We're working proactively with DeSoto County Government and its litter initiative for *Keep DeSoto Beautiful*. Our Public Works, Parks & Recreation, and Code Enforcement Departments are all involved in picking up litter throughout the City and have logged over two hundred hours picking up litter so far this year. The City of Olive Branch provides citizens with complimentary orange litter pick up bags, gloves, and other supplies. These clean up kits are available for **free** to residents and groups who pledge to clean up a section of road, intersections, or parts of neighborhoods any time of the year, but especially for our scheduled Community Clean Up Day. This year, our Community Clean Up Day is Saturday, April 13th. We will be cleaning the Church Road Corridor. Interested groups can join us at City Hall at 9 AM on April 13th. We will divide into teams and head out to clean until Noon. If you are a business, school group, or an HOA/Neighborhood interested in organizing a clean up on this same day, please fill out the form found at www.obms.us/cleanupday. All completed forms will be issued a clean up kit. Businesses and other entities that commit to cleaning up their respected areas will also receive a complimentary decal designating them as a community partner in our efforts to combat litter. Our Community Clean Up Day is also the same day as the County's. Dumpsters will be available across the county. To view these dumpster locations, please visit <https://www.desotocountymis.gov>.

Cleanup kits include:

- Bags to collect trash
- collection gloves
- devices to pick up litter (trash grabbers)
- High Visibility Safety Vests

All City meetings are open to the public and are held at the Court Building located at 6900 Highland Street. 2023 Hall of Fame Inductee: Jason Shifflett



Jason Shifflett grew up in Olive Branch and started working at Domino's Pizza at the age of fourteen making pizza and answering phones. He fell in love with the business and was able to work at a store in Oxford before continuing his education.

While at the University of Mississippi, a management position became available at a store in Senatobia that was at risk of closing due to poor performance. The opportunity was awarded to Shifflett who provided the leadership needed to turn the store around. During his Junior year, he changed his major to Business Administration, was asked to manage the Olive Branch location, and in 1998 he purchased the store where he began his career answering phones--all only two months after graduating.

Shifflett has gone on to receive numerous awards from Domino's and has been recognized as being one of the top 1% of Domino's pizza operators worldwide. Being inducted into the Olive Branch Hall of Fame is the highest honor that the City can bestow upon one of its citizens. The voting body of the Hall of Fame selected Jason Shifflett in 2023.


